


# 1160 Mission Street Neighborhood Guide



## 1 Trinity Plaza/Whole Foods Shopping and Dining

30,000 square feet of new retail space and the largest Whole Foods Market in the city are coming soon to the new development at Trinity Place, meaning that convenient and high-quality groceries and dining will be located just around the corner.

## 2 Civic Center BART Station Transportation

Located just around the block from the SOMA grand, this is your nearest major transportation hub with multiple BART and Muni lines granting easy access to the Embarcadero, Mission District and East Bay.

## 3 UN Plaza Farmers' Market Shopping and Dining

Pick up fresh produce and farm goods only two blocks away at the Heart of the City Farmers' Market. Open Wednesdays 7:00am-5:00pm and Sundays 7:00am-5:30pm year round.

## 4 Commuter Shuttle Stop Transportation

This commuter shuttle stop located at 7th and Market Street is part of the official SFMTA program, providing convenient access to corporate shuttles for your commute.

## 5 Theater District Entertainment

Stretching between Union Square and Civic Center, this diverse collection of world famous venues includes The Orpheum Theater, The Warfield, and ACT's Strand Theater, among many others.

## 6 Westfield Shopping Center Shopping and Dining

A diverse array of amenities in one convenient place: Trader Joe's, coffee shops, fine dining, cheap eats, and a multitude of clothing boutiques and department stores.

## 7 Yerba Buena Gardens Parks and Recreation

This beautiful urban park is also the host of frequent outdoor concerts and beautiful art displays. Perfect for a weekend walk or picnic, stop into the nearby Metreon Mall for refreshment or browse the collections at SFMOMA.

## 8 Yerba Buena Retail Shopping and Dining

This retail corridor stretching between Market and Harrison Streets boasts a wide variety of dining and shopping, including a Whole Foods and culinary highlights such as Mourad, Luke's Lobster, Palette, and Dirty Habit.

## 9 Union Square Retail Shopping and Dining

The bustling heart of San Francisco's downtown is the city's premier commercial district and window shopper's dream! Designer boutiques, high-end jewelry stores, and fine dining options abound.

## 10 Union Square Parks and Recreation

Bored of window shopping? Stop for a break in this landmark San Francisco park. Catch an outdoor concert, go ice skating in the winter, or simply enjoy the views of iconic high rise architecture.

## 11 Mid-Market Corridor Shopping and Dining

San Francisco's central transportation artery is home to both the headquarters of Uber and Twitter, as well as a wide selection of amenities including pharmacies, grocery stores, fitness centers, clothing boutiques and dining.

## 12 Civic Center Plaza Parks and Recreation

Besides the views of San Francisco's City Hall, you will find attractions clustered all around. Some highlights include the renowned Asian Art Museum, SF Main Branch Library, and the world famous Bill Graham Auditorium.

## 13 SF Cultural Hub Entertainment

Located across Van Ness Ave from City Hall is another famous collection of venues including the War Memorial Opera House (home of SF Ballet), Davies Symphony Hall, Herbst Theater and the internationally-renowned SFJAZZ.

## 14 Hayes Valley Corridor Shopping and Dining

Hayes Valley is packed with a fantastic variety of fine dining, cheap eats, boutiques and salons. Some favorites include: Nightbird, Nojo Ramen Tavern, BAIA, Robin, Birba, Suppenküche, The Epicurean Trader, and Fatted Calf.

## 15 SOMA Dining and Nightlife Shopping and Dining

The thriving center of San Francisco's tech industry, SOMA is also home to some of the city's finest dining and nightlife. Some highlights include: Californios, Birdsong, Cellarmaker Brewing Co, Novela, and The Cavalier.

## 16 5th Street Freeway Access Transportation
